## ***From the Pastor...***

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

This has been one of the best summers that I have had in a long time! As I write this, I am preparing to leave for Los Angeles for four days to attend the wedding of Sub-deacon Chris Salamy, who so faithfully served St. John's for two years. During the first part of July, I had the chance to visit my in-laws in Niagara Falls, Canada. Khouria Joan and I were able to visit Toronto for two days, thanks to my in-laws, without kids!! Later I flew to Pittsburgh for the Clergy Symposium at the Antiochian Village. The Village is such a special place! Thanks be to God, our church sent a record 15 kids to the camp, and thanks to the efforts of our Parent Guild and the Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch, any family who requested financial assistance received it! No one, to my knowledge, was prevented from attending the camp due to finances.

Before the Clergy Symposium officially began on Monday, I visited with perhaps my closest friend from the seminary and his wife, whom I have not seen in almost ten years! While recalling our "younger" days at the seminary, we laughed and laughed. We recalled our dorm's nightly ritual, the trip to the local "Seven 11" store. Almost every night about 9:30 p.m. or so, our friend Paul would come by everyone's room collect \$2 and go to the local "Seven 11" for nachos and "Big Gulps." By the time he got back with ten or so orders, we were all ready for a break from our studies and spent the remainder of the night talking and joking!

What does this have to do with St. John of Damascus Church? Plenty! After serving you for six

years as your pastor, I hope that many of you have come to know me. You know that I love each and every one of you – I hope that my ministry thus far has shown this. If I did not care about your life in Christ and take my priesthood seriously, I would stand silent and say nothing. But sometimes we see, I feel, the church as the local "Seven 11." We go there only when we need something.



It amazes me that people will come to church at 8:30 a.m. on a Sunday morning to help set up the coffee hour one week but won't come back the following week at 10 a.m. for Liturgy. It amazes me that people will come to church to baptize their baby then we won't see them, in most cases, until a new baby is born or until the child starts church school. It amazes me that people come to communion after "slipping in" the back door one minute beforehand or even skip the Liturgy all together only to arrive in time for church school and the coffee hour. It amazes me how the church will be packed to the gills (mainly with parishioners) when we have a memorial service but the following week plenty of seating can be found. It amazes me when couples planning on getting married ask more questions about the externals of the day than how they can ask Christ to come into their new life. Sadly, the list goes on and on. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21)

Where is your heart? I know that our parishioners live, in many cases, a distance from the church; I know that their lives and careers are demanding; I know, from having three children of my own, that parenting can be difficult. But your personal relationship with God and His Body, the Church, should be just as important, if not more important, to you as other matters. Shouldn't it? Isn't it time to reevaluate our view of the Church? If you are

unwilling to do this for yourself then who will do it?  
If you don't do it now, when are you going to do it?

This parish didn't just fall from the heavens. If you look at her history, you will see the sacrifices made by our forefathers and mothers. How they gave their dimes and nickels for the church. How they worked and worked to establish the church we now know. When we look to the history of the Church, we see how blood was shed and controversies arose to protect the "orthodoxy" of the Church, to prevent the Church from falling into heresy. We are the spiritual and blood ancestors to these brave and faithful people; hence, our awesome obligation and responsibility as their heirs. Am I suggesting that our church simply become a place to worship the dead? God forbid!! What I am suggesting is a place to worship the Living – Jesus Christ!!

For your sake, for your soul's salvation, and even for my salvation as your priest, reevaluate your faith in God and in the Holy Orthodox Church. As one church father, St. Cyprian of Carthage (if my memory serves me correct), has said, "how can you have God as your Father, if you don't have the Church as your mother?" The Church's doors are open to you. ALL are welcomed into God's house. Can God count on you? "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with me." (Revelation 3:20) May we all have the courage, humility, and desire to see the need to open our hearts and let God come into them. I can guarantee that you won't regret it!






Thank God, the school year has ended successfully and our children have begun their holidays whilst the sisters and I are gradually making preparations for the next term.

Dear Parishioners,

As part of our community outreach program, Saint John's parish has committed to going to **Saint Paul's Shelter** (a satellite shelter of the Pine Street Inn) in Dorchester one Sunday a month in order to provide food for 60-70 homeless men. Last year's program was very successful, and we thank the dozens of volunteers who helped.

Our responsibility is to cook the food in advance, go to the shelter, heat the food, serve it, and then clean up. John Najjar and Sheila Demerjian have volunteered to be responsible for organizing the cooking of the food and the trips to the shelter with a group of people on each of the Sundays involved. We would like 5 people to go each time to help, and we encourage you and your family to sign up. We also need volunteers to cook the food and package it before it goes.

If you decide to be a server, the commitment for the afternoon is merely two and a half hours. You will meet at the church at 4:00 p.m., arrive at the shelter at 4:30 p.m., and then leave the shelter to go back to the church by 6:00 p.m.

Please sign up to either cook or serve, and we will be in touch with you when the time approaches. If you can't do either, perhaps you would like to make a small donation to help with the cost of the food that we have to provide.
